Other fights scheduled are: Gabe Rivas vs. Tony Hervey; Brett Medley vs. Dave Rivas; Eric Meadors vs. Brian Warren; Alex Cisine vs. Mourice Doucett; Miguel Cosio vs. Ben Lagman; and Jimmy Stromo vs. David Vessup. (*Fights subject to change.*)

Doors open at 6:30 the night of the fights. A 21-and-older age requirement to enter the Casino is strictly enforced.
